From the Pastor's Heart: Repent and Believe in the Good News Mark 1:14-20

What is Repentance? When used of human beings, it ordinarily indicates a complete change of mind, a forsaking of one's past existence, and an acceptance of a whole new approach to life.

This proclamation to Repent and Believe in the Good News of Jesus Christ is about embracing a new way of living; Embracing a new life, and a whole new way of being. It is a language of hope that inspires, and emboldens.

It is expected that repentance will be a continuous exercise of letting go of those things that impede our relationship with God and our neighbors, in which we might comprise love for expediency.

Both the book of Jonah, and Gospel Mark parallel on this matter of repentance. God, out of his great love, calls for repentance. Why? In the case of the Ninevites, Jonah was assigned by God to forecast a warning that destruction of their population was imminent if they continued on their course of corruption. If they were to continue to do the ruthless kinds of things that they were practicing, it would ultimately lead to their demise. In God's presence, those things were deemed wrong doing, and so, they were warned of the impending consequence. By their own admission, they were on the verge of being wiped out by some catastrophe.

God, out of love, sent Jonah to Nineveh to give them hope that they might have a chance to change their ways, to turn their lives around, and to correct their erroneous behaviors. There is a scripture which states that God sets before us the consequences of life and death. God tells us to choose life that we may live. The act of repentance is then, the result of turning to that life which God offers by way of Jesus Christ. Choosing to accept and believe in the good news of God, offers us a life that is rich with the goodness of God's grace.

The bible teaches us that we sometimes tend to practice things that work to our own detriment, and that these are the very things that destroy us. Therefore, Jesus calls for repentance because he knows that the ways of the human race, apart from God, are futile. From our perspective, a life apart from God may appear to be promising, but it is in fact, a dead end.

Jesus sees the plight of the human condition, with its vices and inclinations, and he sets out to unfold the message of God's kingdom. The news that he brings to his people, as well as to us today, is not only in words, but also in power. Lives are changed. People are restored. Multiple lives are touched in the most astounding ways. People are made whole, and are set free; and people can see that it is indeed, the good news of God. Repentance is based on our willingness to turn to God, and to follow his lead.

When we think about the Ninevites, we see that their problems arose from their own actions, and it looked as though God was going to punish them for it, but it isn't always God who punishes, we often punish ourselves. We become trapped by our own doing, and when we violate such principles as love, it leads to a

breakdown in our communities, our nation, and our world; and all stems from our personal lives. Therefore, as the Lord says, repent and believe in the good news, because God always stands ready to receive us with grace. Amen.

CHURCH COUNCIL The January meeting of the Church Council took place on January 19. Cindy Smith reported that she plans to conduct a visitation program for interested members of the congregation. Mitchel Smith reported that giving in 2014 was \$11,200 over the previous year. Festival offerings increased by \$1,100, the fuel appeal is \$1,900 over 2014 and building use donations are up by \$1,700 (mainly due to Zumba). Chairperson Barb Halla reported that Operation Christmas Child was successful. The Clinton/Essex/Franklin County group sent out 8,600 boxes! Pastor Wilbert reported the the current Bible study series is winding down and that there will be a new series starting during Lent.

A space heater has been purchased for the Pastor's Office so that it won't be necessary to set the thermostat to manual to provide heat there. We reviewed an estimate for painting the Fellowship Hall and determined that there is a lot of other work that needs to be done first; we need to work on the electrical lines and find a way to enclose the steam pipes. The walls in the Fellowship Hall have not been washed since before the new floor was installed. Organizing a wall washing project seemed like a good Eagle Scout project so we will be contacting local Scout leaders to see if they know of a scout needing a project. We discussed having a roast beef dinner, coupled with a concert. The income from the dinner would support the Community Supper.
